

2005 National Collegiate Crops Contests

Schools participating in the 2005 National Collegiate crops contest included: university of Wisconsin-Platteville, Kansas State University, Virginia Tech University, the University of Minnesota-Crookston, Murray State University, Oklahoma State University, Purdue University, South Dakota State University, University of Tennessee-Martin, and Southeast Community College (NE). The Collegiate Crops contests consist of three parts, plant and seed identification, grain grading, and seed analysis. Results from the two contests produced some very impressive scores. The University of Wisconsin-Platteville won the Chicago Collegiate Crops Contest and placed second in Kansas City. Kansas State University won the Kansas City Board of Trade Collegiate Crops Contest in Kansas City and placed second at Chicago. Virginia Tech University placed third in both contests. Joe Osenga (University of Wisconsin-Platteville) ranked high individually at both Kansas City and Chicago and his score of 1779/1800 at Chicago was the highest achieved since 1980. Rob Proulx (University of Minnesota-Crookston) placed second at both Kansas City and Chicago. Shawn Peterson (Kansas State University) placed third at Kansas City. Steven Kuhlmann (Kansas State University) placed third at Chicago and fourth at Kansas City. Andrew Mitchell (Kansas State University) placed fourth at Chicago. Steve Wilkens (University of Wisconsin-Platteville) placed fifth at Chicago and Rawly Kaufman (Kansas State University) placed fifth in Kansas City. In the team competition at Kansas City, the University of Wisconsin –Platteville placed first in identification and seed analysis and second in grain grading and Kansas State University placed first in grain grading and second in the other two phases. At Chicago, UW-P placed first in seed analysis and grain grading and second in identification. KSU placed first in identification and second in the other two phases. Purdue University placed third in grain grading at Chicago. Virginia

Tech University placed third in identification and seed analysis at Chicago and third in all three phases in Kansas City. At Chicago, Joe Osenga (University of Wisconsin-Platteville) placed first in all three phases of the contest. Individual first place winners at Kansas City were Joe Osenga (University of Wisconsin-Platteville) in identification and seed analysis and Shawn Peterson (Kansas State University) in grain grading. The Kansas City Board of Trade was the primary sponsor of the 72nd Kansas City Collegiate Crops Contest. ASA, CSSA, and the American Royal also provided significant financial support. Scholarship donations were provided by ADM Grain and Pioneer Hi-Bred International, Inc. Vernon Shaffer of Kansas State University served as contest superintendent and Mel Theno was assistant superintendent. At Chicago, the Chicago Board of Trade was the primary sponsor of the 77th Chicago Collegiate Crops Contest, along with ASA, CSSA, the Society of Commercial Seed Technologists, and GROWMARK. Scholarships to the top three individuals, Joe Osenga (UW-P), Rob Proulx (Univ of MN-Crookston), and Steven Kuhlmann (KSU) were provided by the CBOT. DaNell Jamison served as contest superintendent and Judy Sunvold served as assistant superintendent. The grain grading and seed analysis samples for the two contests were prepared by the Federal Grain Inspection Service (FGIS) Technical Service Division in Kansas City, the FGIS Field Office in Kansas City, and the South Dakota State Seed Laboratory.
