Kingsville Citrus Center, Texas AgriLife Research Station in Weslaco, and a commercial vegetable production farm to explore various methods of research and cultivation. The group visited the Estero Llano State Park, part of the World Birding Center (www.worldbirdingcenter.org/sites/weslaco/), for a bird-watching breakfast outing
